

ANGUS COUNCIL

The Long Term Unemployed Programme

The Long Term Unemployed (LTU) supports the provision of paid (real living wage) work placements in either public or third sectors for individuals who would, without significant investment, struggle to secure employment. Placements will equip participants with skills, knowledge, experience and qualifications/training to enable them to move towards a positive destination. It is also a requirement of the funding that during the placement a piece of certified or accredited training is undertaken.

The programme supports Angus residents who are:

- Aged 20-24 who have been unemployed for over 6 months
- Aged over 25 who have been unemployed for over 12 months

Placements should be supernumerary, entry level posts between 16 and 30 hours per week and will be funded for approximately six months. Placements should be work-based rather than home-based to allow clients to receive daily mentor support (this could be provided by a colleague, not necessarily a manager or supervisor) as well as key worker support which will be provided by the skills team. All salary and training/qualifications costs will be fully covered.

A wide variety of placements means that we can best match participants with a placement which interests them e.g. domestic assistant, kitchen assistant, retail, admin, ground worker – the list is endless!
